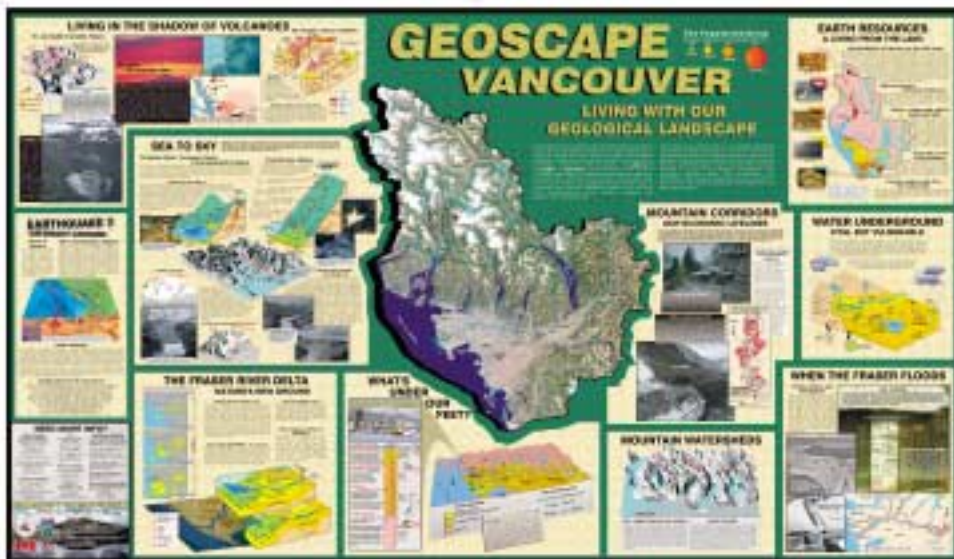

Geoscape Map Series

The Geoscape map series is an example of a type of product that the MAP:GAC project might produce. This series of maps provides an understanding of geoscience issues and promotes wise land use: protecting vital resources, avoiding hazards, and reducing the risk of hazards that cannot be avoided. It is here that geologists, geographers, and engineers can come together and make their contribution to the community. The liveability of an area will, in part, depend on how well we incorporate geological knowledge into our land-use decisions.

MAP:GAC Project Design Phase

Due to unforeseen logistical obstacles the visits of the Canadian MAP:GAC Project Development Team (PDT) (Dr. Catherine Hickson, Dr. Mark Stasiuk, Mr. Mike Ellerbeck) have been postponed. Please review the calendar "MAP:GAC: Revised Project Development Schedule" on page two to see the new itinerary. Please note that during the Project Design Phase, costs related to travel, lodging, per diems of the PDT will be covered by CIDA. Also, for participants attending the first and second meetings (November in Uruguay, and February in Chile), each country is responsible for the costs of travel, lodging, and per diems of its respective representatives. These costs cannot be covered by the project.

In order to maximize the effectiveness of the first two

MAP:GAC meetings it is recommended that each country send at least two representatives: One should be a senior official of the Geological Survey (ie. Vice Minister, Director, Sub-Director), and the other should be a senior scientist of the Geological Survey (preferably someone involved in Geological Hazard work) who may become the Project Leader or Coordinator.

Information Required from the Countries

We have received answers from all countries to the questionnaire that appeared in our July newsletter. This questionnaire is indispensable in the preparation of the Project Design Report and Work Plan that will be submitted to CIDA.

First MAP:GAC Teleconference

The first MAP:GAC teleconference took place on September 20th, 2001 (despite phone line troubles early on in the call) with project representatives from Argentina, Bolivia, Colombia,

Chile, Peru and Venezuela. It was not possible to link to Ecuador so they were called afterwards and brought up to date on the outcome of the conference call. This first meeting took place to communicate to the project members:

- **Project Status:** CIDA approval of the concept paper and project design stage.
- **First Meeting:** Friday, November 16th, 2001, during the XI Latinoamerican Geological Congress in Montevideo, Uruguay.
- **Second Meeting:** First week of February 2002 in Santiago, Chile.
- **MOU:** Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between the country and Canada during the CAMMA ("Conferencia Anual de Ministerios de Minería de las Americas") meeting in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.

- **Country visits:** Dr. Catherine Hickson, Dr. Mark Stasiuk and Mr. Mike Ellerbeck will visit each member country for 3 to 5 days starting in October thru January 2002 (see calendar).

- **Seminar:** Hickson stated that Chile will conduct a Seminar in October called: Early Warning: Model for the New Millennium for Disaster Prevention. For more information please contact Dr. Alberto Maturana at: amaturan@entelchile.net
